Sacrament of Reconciliation 30 minutes prior to Mass or by appointment

Reflection: A Liberating Reality. *Take, eat, he said, this is my body which is broken for many.* These words might well have alarmed them; if they did not, it was because Christ had already told them many marvelous things about this sacrament. In fact, they had been so well prepared that there was no need for him to say any more. But he told them that the reason he was going to suffer was to take away our sins. He spoke of the blood of the new covenant, that is, of the promise, the new law. He had promised long before that the new covenant had been ratified by his blood. As the old covenant had been ratified by the blood of sheep and calves, so the new covenant was to be ratified by the blood of the Lord. Thus, by speaking of his covenant and by reminding them that the old covenant had also been inaugurated by the shedding of blood, he made known to them that he was soon to die. And he told them once again the reason for his death in the words, *This is my blood, which is poured out for all for the forgiveness of sins*, and, *Do this in memory of me.* ~St. John Chrysostom
