Reflection: Our Hidden Neighbors. I am tormented. I am tormented with the situation of the old, the helpless, the hopeless, the ones who “die” from loneliness! My torment is not only for those in hospitals and in nursing homes. (There are people who are already doing good work in that area.) It is the others – the even more forgotten and rejected ones, the other *humiliate* – who need our help. How we are going to do this, I do not know. We have to pray, and we have to search. God will show us the way. It is a very simple thing I am asking. We are already doing much of this already, but we have the capacity to do more! Go out ... be free ... do it! They are on the streets, in rooming houses, in offices, in condominiums. They are the hidden ones, the overlooked ones, the neglected ones. The “real” rejects of society already knock on our door, seeking our help. But these others we have to look for! They may be very poor in the economic sense. Or they may be very rich. They may be politicians, or civil servants, or wards of the state. It is up to us to seek them out. It is up to us to make friends with them, to help them in a very special manner – the only manner by which they can be helped: *love*! ~Catherine de Hueck Doherty
