Palm Sunday Reflection

Called to Share in the Servanthood of Christ

A servant is a person called to serve the needs of others, especially the needs of a superior. For one to be a good servant, there is the need to know the demands of his or her boss and be ready to discharge the duties expected of a servant when called upon. In the first reading, the Prophet Isaiah makes us aware of what it takes to be a servant of God: the ability to carry God's word to His people, being attentive to the instructions of the master and being ready to comply with them. There is no need to give any excuse no matter how challenging the duties one is called upon to discharge. All these demands call for a life of humility as we see in Our Lord Jesus Christ as portrayed by St. Paul in the second reading. "Christ Jesus, though he was in the form of God did not regard equality with God.... Rather, he emptied himself taking the form of slave" (Phil. 2 :6-7). The culmination of this servanthood of Christ is what we heard in the Gospel of the day. He humbled himself, becoming obedient to the point of death on a cross. My brothers and sisters, this is the life in which we are called to share. A life of humble service to God and humankind. It becomes very challenging when we serve among our own people who seem not to acknowledge good that we do for them as we serve God through Christ. How do we reflect this humble image of Christ in our response to the service we render to God and to one another? How selfless are we in our service?--*Father Emmanuel*
