Sacrament of Reconciliation 30 Minutes before Each Mass

Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity - Reflection

Today, we celebrate the solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity: the reality of the three persons in One God; the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. The idea of the Trinity is essentially captured in the communality of the Godhead. For us Catholics, the concept of the Trinity is not new to us. We demonstrate its reality in our day to day activities; for example, at the beginning of our prayers, during baptism and at the beginning of the Mass. The communality of the Trinity and each person in the Godhead performing their respective roles in order to achieve an intended goal, brings out the beauty of Unity in Diversity. This image of unity in diversity is one of the ideals we share with God when He says, let us create man to be like us. The binding forces within the Trinity are love for one another and the respect of each personality within the Godhead. They identify the abilities and capabilities of each personality. Jesus said, "I have much more to tell you but you cannot bear it now. But when he comes, the Spirit of truth, he will guide you to all truth; for this reason I told you that he will take from me what is mine and declare it to you" (Jn. 16 :12 - 15). Our families, churches, communities and nations are all groups of people with individual capabilities. Let us take a lesson from the life of the Triune God to love and trust each person when we come together to work for a common goal, which is the highest goal. A community whose life is centered around only an individual hardly makes progress and the achievement of its goal is normally hampered.---*Father Emmanuel*
